- Students will be a visitor and observe what is going on during that working day.


As a visitor the student should be covered by the visitor/guest insurance of the organisation.

- Any spare moments a book to read




Arrangements for the 27th April 2023





Special Opportunities


- Includes £5 million-worth of grants, bursaries, scholarships, contextual offers and extracurricular activities
