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Dear Parents/Carers:

We hope this letter finds you well. We are excited to inform you that the Go4Schools online platform and app are now accessible for both parents and students. These resources offer valuable insights into your child's progress at Hitchin Girls' School and are designed to improve our communication with you regarding their studies.

How can I see the progress being made by my child?

To access the Go4Schools website and app, you can use the same login credentials as you have been using; we encourage you to log in and explore the features available to you. Soon, data about your child's performance will become visible on the **progress** tab. Here, both parents and students will be able to view assessment data for each subject. This information will be updated as our staff input data from each department, allowing you to monitor the progress your child is making throughout the academic year.

How is progress measured for each subject?

Our new assessment system for KS3 this year means that in each subject, your child will be awarded one of the following four **bands**:

Excelling	Demonstrates performance well-above expected levels.		
Advancing	Demonstrates assured understanding and higher-level performance.		
Secure	Demonstrates a firm grasp of the curriculum.		
Developing	Demonstrates some progress towards a firm grasp of the curriculum.		















NB: If there is insufficient evidence of any notable progress made towards meeting the curriculum, your child will be awarded the band "**Not Yet**". Awarding of this band may be accompanied by further intervention to ensure your child is able to make progress towards meeting our curriculum.

An example of what the progress tab will begin to look like is attached below:



What do the bands ("Developing, Secure, Advancing, Excelling") mean in practice?

We have introduced a new section on the school website that provides assessment criteria for each subject in Years 7, 8, 9. This section allows you to gain a more in-depth understanding of what each awarded level means in terms of your child's knowledge and skill development and how it aligns with our curriculum objectives. It also offers suggestions for improvement and how to progress to the next level.

An example from Year 7 Geography is attached below:

What does HPA, MPA and LPA mean?

In order to offer a consistent structure of the assessment of your child's prior attainment, we have also recorded historical data in a common language. The three data points recorded are:

- Cognitive Ability Tests (CATs)
- KS2 SATS outcomes, and
- Reading age.

Data within each of these strands is recorded on Go4Schools as either:

- High Prior Attaining (HPA)
- Middle Prior Attaining (MPA), or
- Low Prior Attaining (LPA).

This data is used by staff to identify students that may be capable of working at a consistently higher level beyond the expectations of the age related curriculum they are studying and may benefit from additional stretch and challenge in lessons. This does not limit our aspirations for your child, nor should it limit their own.

We believe that these resources will facilitate a stronger connection between the school and your family, enabling you to actively engage in your child's education. We encourage you to explore Go4Schools and the assessment criteria to better understand and support your child's academic studies.
